

Vocational training in Germany (Ausbildung)

Ceramicist (Keramiker/in)

Keramiker / Keramikerin

You shape, decorate and fire clay objects, from tableware to stove tiles: a 3-year training in a craft workshop, with classes at a vocational school.

What a ceramicist does

They prepare the clay body, shape the piece on the wheel or in a plaster mould, glaze it and fire it in the kiln until it becomes the finished object.

Shape

Throw round forms on the wheel, model sculptures or cast clay in plaster moulds for repeat pieces.

Decorate

Paint, glaze and decorate raw or bisque-fired pieces from a design, often created by the ceramicist.

Fire and check

Run the firings, monitor the drying and spot defects before the pieces are sold.

This occupation is for you if...

- ✓ you have manual dexterity and good hand-eye coordination
- ✓ you enjoy drawing and imagining shapes and decorations
- ✓ you are careful and patient, right down to the details
- ✓ you are fine with workshop work and the heat of the kiln

Less suitable if...

- you cope badly with clay dust and paint fumes
- you want an office job with no manual work
- you dislike repetitive, meticulous tasks

A TYPICAL DAY IN THE WORKSHOP

- 07:30 Preparing the clay body** : Weigh the materials, mix the clay body and get it ready for shaping.
- 09:00 Throwing pieces** : Form cups, bowls or vases on the wheel, keeping the measurements consistent.
- 11:00 Finishing and assembly** : Attach handles, trim raw pieces and correct small flaws.
- 13:00 Glazing and decoration** : Apply glazes and patterns to pieces that have already been bisque-fired.
- 15:00 Loading and firing** : Load the kiln, set the temperature rise and follow the firing.
- 16:30 Checking and tidying** : Examine pieces from the kiln, note any defects and clean the workshop.

How the Ausbildung works

In Germany you learn by working: this is the "dual system". You are an employee of a company and a student at a vocational school (Berufsschule) at the same time.

3 to 4 days a week at the company

1-2 days school

Year 1

The basics

- Safety, tools, organisation
- Preparing clay bodies
- Shaping simple blanks

Year 2

Surfaces and firing

- Glazes, slips and decoration
- Drying and firing pieces
- Intermediate exam

Year 3

Specialisation

- Two options of your choice
- Quality control of pieces
- Journeyman's exam

Exams and qualification

An intermediate exam (Zwischenprüfung) towards the end of the second year, then the journeyman's exam (Gesellenprüfung): making a product, producing blanks, technology and design, economics and social studies. You obtain the Gesellenbrief, issued under the authority of the Chamber of Crafts (HWK).

Pay

You are paid during the training. Throughout the training.

What you need to apply

- ✓ Baccalaureate level is required.
- ✓ The required level is B2. Good technical vocabulary for the trade is a real plus.
- ✓ The work is done in a workshop, sometimes in heat, with paint fumes and clay dust. Heat-resistant gloves, goggles and sometimes a mask are worn, and shift work is possible.

Documents to prepare

- ✓ CV and cover letter in German
- ✓ Translated baccalaureate diplomas and transcripts
- ✓ German B2 level certificate

Where it can lead

STRAIGHT AWAY

Qualified ceramicist

Work in a craft ceramics workshop: tableware, stove tiles, decorative objects.

WITH EXPERIENCE

Master ceramicist

Take the Meister (master craftsman) exam to run a workshop and train apprentices.

LONGER TERM

Studies or own workshop

With the required entry level, study ceramics or open your own workshop.
